About Halcy Bohen, Artist

Halcy Bohen's affinity for drawing and painting is akin to her other professional lives-- as a psychologist, teacher, author and Princeton University dean. Each role requires both close observation and a creative response from her. She thrives on the engagement with people and places in all these realms. In the visual arts, she often records her take on unique moments in specific settings, at home and abroad.
